You must be present at all times the fire is burning or smoldering. IT must be completely extinguished before leaving your burn.

Limit your pile(s) to 3x3, have a charged water source and any tools you may need during burning. No burning when winds are over 10MPH unless other wise authorized. NO fires will be allowed during RED FLAG DAYS.

Recreational fires or camp cooking warming fires have different restrictions. They will be in a camp style ring or patio permitted fire pit or container. Only wood gas or charcoal maybe used for your cooking/warming fire and NO Fire will be permitted during Red Flag or Staging Conditions – check your local fire department for any restrictions.

Allowable burning material: Leaves, brush, limbs, grass or pine-needles- organic material, no burning of garbage will be permitted. Heavy smoke material should be restricted due to comfort of your neighbors. Use good judgement.

Use Appropriate tools for your fire, shovel, rake, CHARGED WATER HOSE.

Permit Conditions

1. Permittee must call **(928) 367-3473** prior to burning each day to receive burn approval.
2. Fires can be started no earlier than one hour after sunrise. Burn must be extinguished at least two hours before sunset.
3. Permittee must attend fire at all times until it is completely extinguished.
4. Permittee must have a copy of this permit on-site during open burning.
5. Permittee must start fire using items that do not cause the production of black smoke.
6. Permittee can only conduct open burning during atmospheric conditions that:
 - a. Prevent dispersion of smoke into populated areas
 - b. Prevent visibility impairments on roads or at airports that result in a safety hazard
 - c. Do not create a public nuisance or adversely affect public safety
 - d. Do not cause an adverse impact to visibility in a Class I area
 - e. Do not cause uncontrollable spreading of the fire
7. Burning cannot be conducted when an air stagnation advisory has been issued by the National Weather Service for the area.
8. Burning cannot be conducted when any stage air pollution episode has been declared.
9. Any public official may order that the burn be extinguished or may prohibit burning during periods of inadequate smoke dispersion, excessive visibility impairment, or extreme fire danger.

ARS 13-1706. It is unlawful for any person, without lawful authority, to intentionally, knowingly, recklessly or with criminal negligence to set or cause to be set on fire any wildland other than the person's own or permit a fire that was set or caused to be set by the person to pass from the person's own grounds to the grounds of another person. A person who violates this section is guilty of a class 1 misdemeanor, class 2 misdemeanor, class 3 felony or class 6

Use Good Judgement, if winds become high, please extinguish, be courteous and aware of your neighbors. The Firefighters will check burns called into dispatch by neighbors. _____
